Clair de Monteil, is quickly gaining recognition around the world as an important soprano on the rise. Currently a resident artist at the Academy of Vocal Arts in Philadelphia, her performances include the title roles in *Suor Angelica* and *Ariadne auf Naxos*, Leonora in *Il Trovatore*, and Fiordiligi in *Così fan tutte*, among others.

A Paris native, she received her education at the Haute Ecole de Musique in Geneva and has gone on to win many important

competitions prizes, including a Grant in Gerda Lissner Opera Competition, First Prizes in France's Opera en Arles Competition and Opera Grand Avignon Competition, and First Prize in the Giargiari Bel Canto Competition

Most recently, she was a semifinalist of the 38th International Hans Gabor Belvedere Singing Competition in Villach, Austria and the 3rd prize winner of the Loren L. Zachary Society for the Performing Arts Competition in Los Angeles.



Holly Flack, Coloratura soprano Holly Flack has a unique range that extends beyond an octave above high C. Ms. Flack's recent roles include Queen of the Night (*The Magic Flute*), Ophélie (*Hamlet*), Morgana (*Alcina*), Elvira (*L'Italiana in Algeri*), and Gilda (*Rigoletto*). As a young artist, she covered Marie (*Daughter of the Regiment*) with Fargo-Moorhead Opera, Olympia (*Les Contes d'Hoffmann*) with St. Petersburg Opera, and performed Maggie Anderson (*Brigadoon*) with Ohio Light Opera.

As a featured artist with the iSing! International Young Artists Festival, she was specifically chosen to perform for China's National Day Celebration on Dragon TV. She has traveled regularly to China for concerts in different cities around the country.

Ms. Flack made her international debut at the Trentino Music Festival in Mezzano, Italy singing the role of the Vixen (*The Cunning Little Vixen*). She has also performed with the Bel Canto Opera Festival, Astoria Opera Festival, and Operafestival di Roma.

Originally from Portland, Oregon, she holds a Bachelor's Degree in Vocal Performance from St. Olaf College, and a Master's Degree in Vocal Performance from the University of Kentucky.



Maria Zoi, described as a real mezzo-soprano, has been praised by critics for her wide vocal range and her unique, colorful timber. She recently won 3rd Prize in the Edward M. Murray International Opera Competition 2019 of Opera Ithaca, She was selected by Maestro Jose Carreras to take part in his fourth International Singing Masterclass in Pesaro, Italy and was one of the 11 best singers and the only mezzo-soprano chosen to sing at the final concert of the program at Auditorium Pedrotti.

Ms. Zoi has accumulated significant experience performing at distinguished venues worldwide. Upcoming engagements include performances with the Met Opera Guild and Opera Ithaca NY. She has sung roles of the lyric mezzo-soprano repertoire including Rosina (*Il barbiere di Siviglia*), Dorabella (*Cosi fan tutte*), Cherubino (*Le nozze di Figaro*), Prince Orlofsky (*Die Fledermaus*), Flora Bervoix (*La Traviata*) with the Greek National Opera, and in freelance productions in Germany and Austria.

She graduated in 2015 from the University of Music & Performing Arts in Munich with the highest degree (Meisterklasse Gesang). In 2016 she was awarded a scholarship for the Bayreuth Festival from the Richard Wagner Association of the city of Duesseldorf.



Mary Pinto, an acclaimed accompanist and vocal coach, has worked with international opera singers and major American opera companies for the past 25 years. She began her professional career as a rehearsal pianist for several noted opera companies: Dallas Opera, Chicago's Lyric Opera, Omaha Opera, and others. In 2012, Ms. Pinto coached and served as rehearsal pianist for Metropolitan Opera star and international soprano Deborah Voigt as she prepared for the three Brünhilde roles for the Met's production of Wagner's *Ring Cycle*

which was featured in the documentary *Wagner's Dream: The Making of the Met's Ring Cycle* and premiered at the 2012 Tribeca Film Festival.

In 2014, she performed with Opera Noire's Ensemble in the American Embassy in Moscow and St. Petersburg; spent last three summers as coaching staff at Masterclass d' Ischia, Italy; and as an accompanist for the 2016 Martina Arroyo Foundation, *La Bohème* production.

Since 2007 Ms. Pinto has been on the faculty of Montclair State University as s private coach, accompanist, and preparing students for opera productions. She joined the adjunct faculty at SUNY Purchase College in fall 2018, where she teaches Italian and French lyric diction, operatic styles, and coaches.

Since 2014, she has served as the Vice-President and Music Director for Opera at Florham while maintaining a coaching studio in both New Jersey and New York City.

Mary received her Bachelor's degree in Music for piano performance from DePauw University and a Master's in Music degree for piano and voice accompaniment from University of Illinois.



Mariana Karpatova mezzo-soprano Highlights of her opera appearances include Sarasota Opera as Cuniza in *Oberto*, the Spoleto USA Festival, the Bulgarian National Opera as Azucena in *Il Trovatore*, Baltimore Opera and Palm Beach Opera as Olga and Larina in *Eugene Onegin*, Coro Lirico as Amneris *in* Aida and Fenena in *Nabucco*.

On the concert stage, she has performed Mahler's Symphony No. 8

and Das Lied von der Erde, Verdi's Messa da Requiem, Prokofiev's Alexander Nevsky, Shoenberg's Gurrelieder, Ravel's Scheherazade, Bach's Magnificat and St. Matthew Passion, Beethoven's Mass in C, Durufle's Requiem, Haydn's Lord Nelson Mass, Verdi's Requiem and others.

She is a recognized specialist training youth and advanced professional singers for contemporary and classical music. Since 2002 she has maintained a private practice (Mariana Voice Studio) teaching singing and is currently a member of the vocal teaching staff at Fairleigh Dickinson University in Madison.


